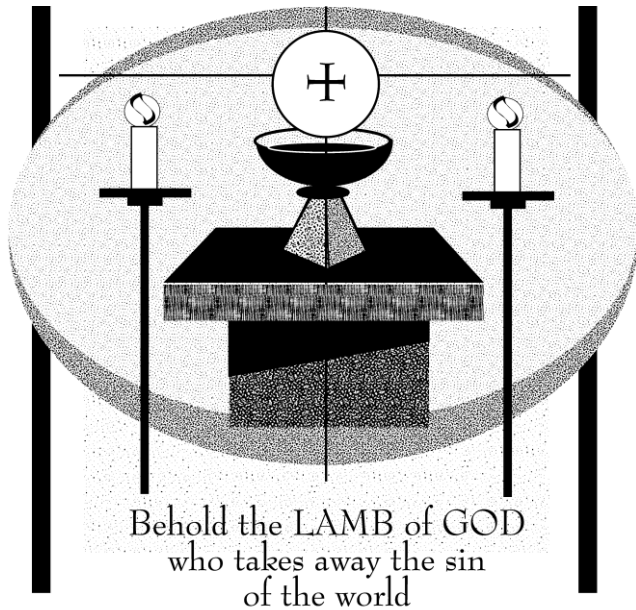


**Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection on the Scriptures

"Look! There is the Lamb of God!" —John 1:36

For generations we have fashioned a culture of death — step by step, war by war, abortion by abortion, injustice by injustice, sin by sin. Our seeds of unfaithfulness, lust, and greed have grown into a sickeningly rich harvest of injustice. Is there any hope?

In Christ alone there is hope. He is the Lamb of God Who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29). Jesus is "the Messiah! (This term means the Anointed)" (John 1:41) and "Rabbi (which means Teacher)" (John 1:38). He is "the Way, and the Truth, and the Life" (John 14:6). He will call our names (see 1 Samuel 3:4) and change our names (see John 1:42). Jesus will bring good news to the poor, "proclaim liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind and release to prisoners, to announce a year of favor from the Lord" (Luke 4:18-19). Jesus is bringing down the culture of death and replacing it with a civilization of love and life.

There is hope; there is certain hope in Jesus — in Jesus alone. Alleluia!
