Because our mission is still “out there”, in the community, to people who have yet to know Christ, to those who feel lost, all alone, and without hope.

Even though we will be adding a few more walls to our campus, our mission will remain unchanged: to be a Church without walls for a Love without limits.

So with praise and thanksgiving to God and with sincere gratitude for all who have worked so hard to bring us to this moment, let us recommit ourselves to this great project that will serve our parish and our community for years to come.
